SMART BEGINNINGS SOUTHEAST SUPPORTS AL'S PALS!

Al's Pals: Kids Making Healthy Choices is a nationally recognized, resilience-based early childhood curriculum and teacher training program that develops social, emotional and behavioral skills in children 3 to 8 years old. The Al's Pals interactive lessons and teaching approaches help young children learn to regulate their emotions and make healthy choices.



FREE TRAININGS AND MATERIALS

Two day training for individual participants to attend sessions held in centralized locations arranged by Wingspan for new teachers to get trained in Al's Pals ("face to face" or online). All new programs who participate in Al's Pals through SB Southeast will receive an Al's Pals kit (a \$725 value), support materials, and mentoring by a trained Al's Pals coach. Dates TBA. Three hour face-to-face **Advanced Training** conducted on-site in Hopewell. EARN YOUR CHILD DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATE CREDENTIAL **START NOW!**

The Child Development Associate (CDA) credential is a national credential awarded by the Council for Professional Recognition to individuals who have successfully completed the CDA assessment process. Many view the CDA Credential as an instrument for career advancement in the early childhood care and education profession. In our local area, earning your CDA credential will give you a jump start in college towards an Associate's Degree in Early Childhood at John Tyler Community College, where you can earn up to 8 college credits by completing your CDA!

Smart Beginnings Southeast has helped nearly 100 candidates earn a CDA credential! Will you be next? Classes for CDA meet monthly and participants are provided with materials needed to complete module assignments at home. Completion of the course takes 12-15 months and the cost is \$25.00/month.

SO MANY GOODBYES

Ways to ease the transition between home and groups for young children

"Good feelings are contagious! If you are genuinely enthusiastic about an upcoming change, your child will look forward to it too." If you are satisfied with the quality of the care you have chosen you will feel more comfortable with your choice. High quality programs know how to transition children as a part of their program and you as a parent will want to ask how the center or program manages transitions.

Children between the ages of 5 months and 3 years often experience separation anxiety. This may involve the child screaming, crying or clinging. "The bright side, however, is that separation anxiety marks a big step in your child's development: Your child has already learned to care about you and is aware that she or he is separating from you!" This is the beginning of meaningful relationships.

"From birth, your children grow closer to you and independent at the same time. How you handle the situation can set the stage for how well your child adjusts to other challenges in life. Be sure your actions and words are a good example!"

All children feel more comfortable when they know what to expect. "A few days to anticipate a change in caregiver or setting will be sufficient for infants

and toddlers, while preschoolers may appreciate a week or two to get ready. Kindergarten or primary-school children may start asking months in advance." Drive or walk past the new building. Try to meet the caregiver or teacher in advance in the location where the child will be. Many programs encourage this transition opportunity and have a transition procedure set up for you.

"At last, the long anticipated day is about to arrive. The night before you will probably start some new routines. These rituals, like bedtime stories, add predictability and are comforting in unfamiliar situations. They add continuity to each passing day." Taking familiar pictures or objects to the center helps children transition from one familiar situation to a less familiar one.

Allow lots of time on the first day to alleviate additional stress. The commute to the new environment brings an opportunity to talk and should be a positive part of your new routine.

Get to the center early so you will have plenty of time to help your child settle in and get involved in play before you leave. Engage in conversation with the caregiver as they welcome your child.

"Early childhood professionals know children are interesting, likable people, and every family is respected."

"When it is time for you to go no matter how tempting it might be to slip out unnoticed, you will violate your child's trust if you leave without saying goodbye."

Be sure to tell your child how and when you will pick them up. Offer comforting words like "I know it's hard to say goodbye." In summary, be positive in thought and word about the change, prepare for the change, engage in the transition with the new care provider and always say "goodbye!"
